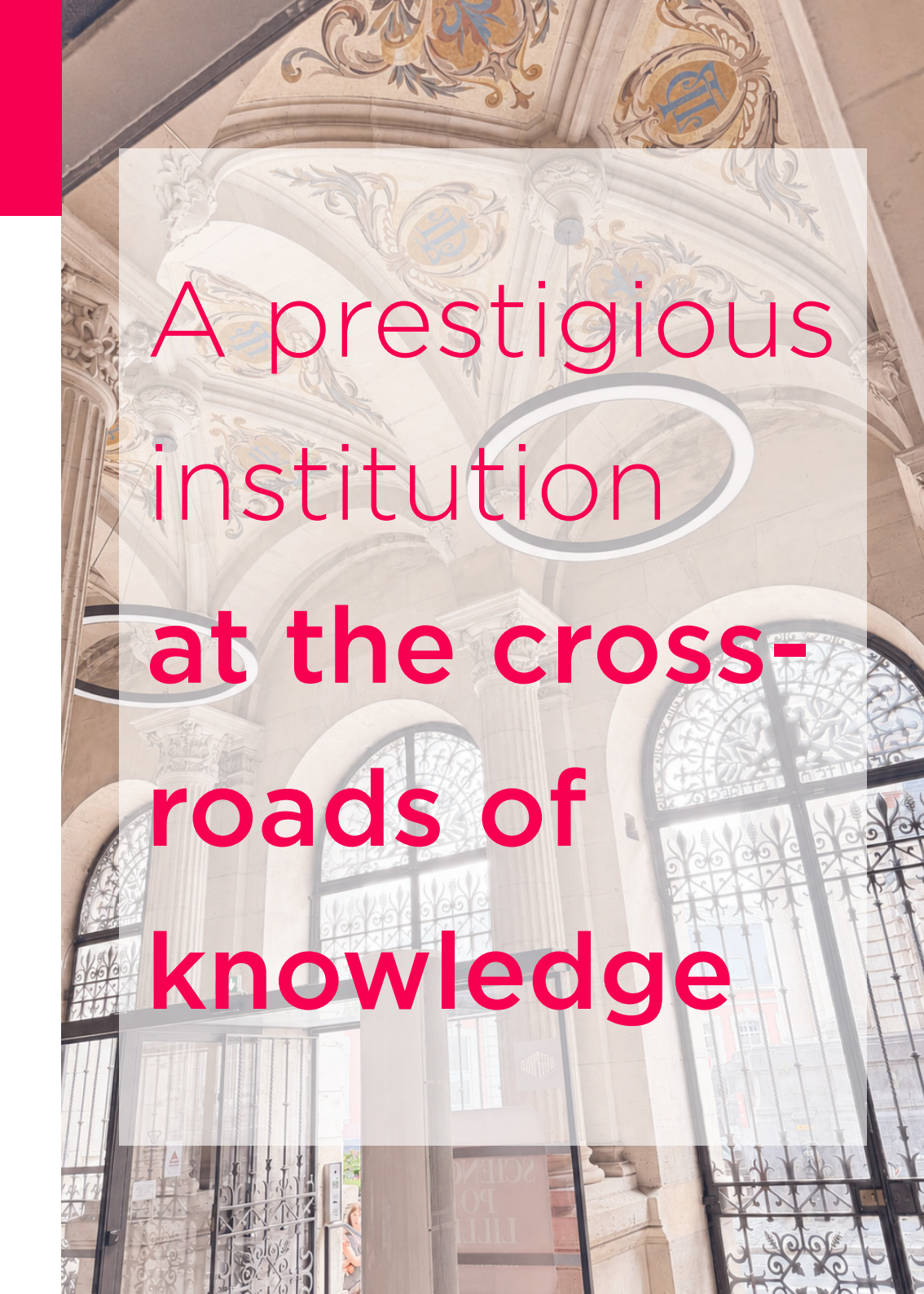

A prestigious institution at the cross- roads of knowledge

SCIENCES PO LILLE

As a leading public institution in the humanities and social sciences, Sciences Po Lille has been preparing students for more than thirty years for careers in the public, private, and nonprofit sectors, both in France and around the world.

A member of the Sciences Po Network and the Conférence des grandes écoles (CGE), and a partner of the University of Lille, Sciences Po Lille offers a five-year curriculum leading to a master's-level degree. Bringing disciplines together, comparing perspectives, and developing rigorous, structured thinking are central to the school's educational mission. This approach enables students to understand the major issues shaping the contemporary world and to make informed decisions.

A multidisciplinary curriculum

Political science, law, economics, history, international relations, sociology, and modern languages : the breadth of the curriculum enables students to build a strong foundation of knowledge, sharpen their critical thinking skills, and gradually shape their academic and professional goals.

A school open to the world

International experience is an integral part of the curriculum. Students spend their third year abroad, either studying at a partner institution or completing a professional placement, before returning to pursue their specialization at the master's level.

This international outlook is reflected throughout campus life, through more than 230 academic partnerships and the presence of international students and visiting faculty from around the world.

SCIENCES PO LILLE

A Committed Institution

Sciences Po Lille is dedicated to a **public service** mission rooted in **academic excellence, equal opportunity, and social inclusion**.

This commitment is reflected in particular through the Integrated Studies Program (PEI), which each year supports nearly 1,000 young people from the Hauts-de-France region as they explore higher education and prepare for competitive entrance exams.

Research, partnerships with public sector organisations, businesses and nonprofit organisations also contribute to making Sciences Po Lille an institution connected to the major challenges of our time.

A campus in the heart of Lille

Located on rue Angellier, in the heart of Lille, Sciences Po Lille is housed in the historic buildings of the former law and humanities faculties, as well as in the former university library.

In 2026, the campus gained a new facility with the opening of L'Atelier. This renovated former industrial building reflects the transformation of Lille's architectural heritage, providing spaces dedicated to teaching, research, collaborative work and campus life.



Sciences Po Lille is located in the heart of the Saint-Michel neighborhood, in the historic buildings that once housed the law and humanities faculties, the former Lille University Library, and a former large mechanical workshop.



Library

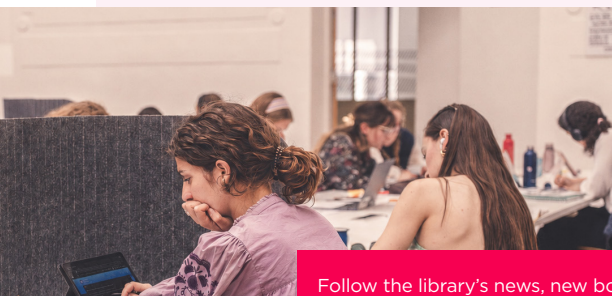
The library is open 7 days a week from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m.

It spans two floors and offers quiet study areas surrounded by plants, individual workspaces, group study rooms (bookable via the Affluences app), a learning lab, a kitchenette for reheating meals, a lounge where you can read the press, borrow a game or relax, an outdoor terrace where you can get some fresh air, and a small café near the entrance for a snack break.

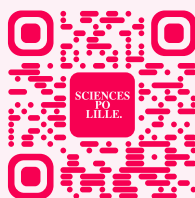
- A wide variety of collections, available on-site and online, covering the humanities, political science, law, economics, international relations, and history, as well as literature, general knowledge, languages, academic journals, DVDs, and comic books.
- The library also lends everyday items (from noise-canceling headphones to phone chargers, from drills to raclette machines).
- You can buy highlighters and index cards next to the printer, or fill up your water bottle at the water fountain.

L'Atelier

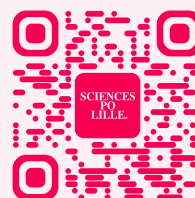
L'Atelier is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Opened in 2026, L'Atelier is the new building of Sciences Po Lille. Designed as an open and welcoming space, it complements the historic campus with new facilities dedicated to teaching, research, collaborative work and student life.

Designed to adapt to the different needs of the day, L'Atelier is a place where students can attend classes, work on group projects, have lunch, conduct research, or take part in events organized by the school.

- **Flexible teaching spaces** : L'Atelier features three modular classrooms suitable for hosting classes, lectures, workshops, and various Sciences Po Lille events.
- **Workspaces** : A shared workspace is available for individual or group work. Five soundproof booths also allow students to meet and work in groups without disturbing other users. L'Atelier also includes a Research Room, intended for doctoral students as well as faculty members. It offers a quiet environment well-suited for research, writing, and consulting reference materials.
- **A social space** : A space equipped with a microwave allows students to have lunch on-site between classes and enjoy a friendly get-together.
- **Green outdoor spaces** : L'Atelier features two landscaped patios and a garden. These outdoor spaces are ideal for relaxing, socializing, or working when the weather permits.
- ▶ **A shared space** : L'Atelier is a common space for the entire Sciences Po Lille community. To ensure that everyone can enjoy it under the best conditions, please respect the facilities and equipment provided.

Sexual and gender-based violence : how to respond ?

At Sciences Po Lille

Sciences Po Lille has set up a listening and support unit for people who have experienced or witnessed sexual and gender-based violence. It is open to students and members of the school's staff.

Its role is to listen, provide information and offer support based on each person's situation and needs. It can refer people to professionals or specialised services for psychological or legal support and provide information about possible disciplinary or criminal proceedings. You can contact the Sciences Po Lille listening unit at : ecoute.VSS@sciencespo-lille.eu

A member of the unit will respond within 48 working hours. You will then be offered an appointment with two members of the unit within seven working days. This initial meeting takes place in a confidential setting. Its purpose is to listen to you, better understand your situation, identify your support needs and discuss with you what you would like to do next.

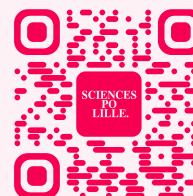

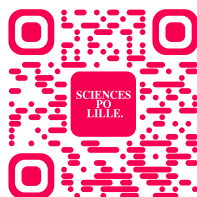
Off-campus contacts

● CNAÉ

The Cnaé is a reporting and support hotline set up by the MESR and managed by the “En avant toutes” association. It allows callers to talk about and report situations that could be classified as criminal (discrimination, harassment, sexist and sexual violence). Situations are officially reported only if the caller agrees. In such cases, a report is sent to the Rectorat which then contacts the university.

Complementary to Sciences Po Lille's own hotline, the Cnaé is specifically designed for those who, at first or at all, do not wish to confide their situation within their own university.

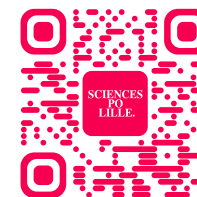

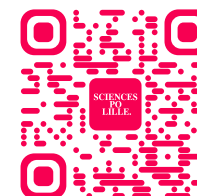

Reporting procedures

SEXUAL, SEXIST, HOMOPHOBIC AND TRANSPHOBIC VIOLENCE : reporting a situation

● Who can report an incident ?

Any person or group of people who were a victim or witness. **Any and all members of the staff (administrative and/or academic) and any and all students** may call upon this service.

● How do I make a report ?

Go to the website www.sciencespo-lille.eu, where you'll find the online report form.

● What happens once a report is filed ?

The report will be examined by a group of counsellors and appropriate recommendations will be made to the director, who is the only person who can instigate procedures : administrative inquiry and, if necessary, invoke the disciplinary board. You will be contacted within 2 workdays to finalize and, if needed, complete your report and determine any assistance you may need.

● Why make a report ?

To evaluate the situation, according to the facts and evidence provided, instigate any provisional measures and disciplinary actions that may be necessary.

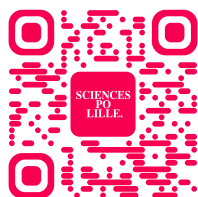
● What about confidentiality ?

The support is strictly confidential.

If the report is anonymous, no action (support, procedures, etc.) can be taken. If a disciplinary procedure is instigated, your identity, and that of any witnesses, will appear in the case file and the disciplinary report.

The members of the disciplinary board must respect confidentiality throughout the entirety of the procedure (once the investigators have been assigned, they have two months to complete the investigation).

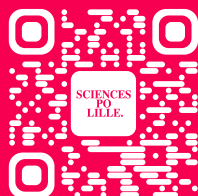

RACISM, ANTISEMITISM AND DISCRIMINATION :

Support and assistance for victims

● Who can make a report ?

Any student or member of staff who has experienced or witnessed discrimination or racist or antisemitic remarks made by a student or a member of the teaching, administrative or technical staff.

● How can I make a report ?

The officer responsible for combating racism, antisemitism and discrimination is available to listen to you, provide information, support you and direct you to the appropriate services, in complete confidentiality.

Reports may be submitted anonymously or with your name.

● What incidents should be reported ?

Incitement to hatred against an individual or a group of people, or insults or defamatory statements directed at an individual or group because of their actual or perceived origin or affiliation with a particular religion.

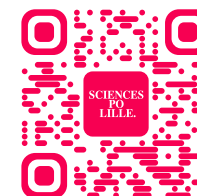
Discrimination against a person on the grounds of disability, origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or actual or perceived affiliation with a particular religion

● What happens after a report has been submitted ?

The report will be reviewed collectively by the Racism, Antisemitism and Discrimination Reporting Committee. The committee will then recommend to the Director of Sciences Po Lille the most appropriate measures for handling the reported incident.

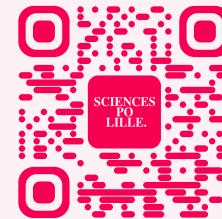
Depending on the circumstances, the matter may be referred to the Disciplinary Board.

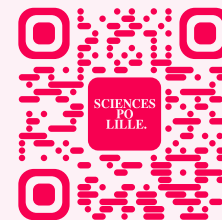
